As an institution of higher education, Buffalo State University respects and fully supports the free speech rights granted to individuals under both the First Amendment to the United States Constitution and New York State law. As a public entity, partially funded by New York State tax dollars, the university will provide a designated public forum to campus constituents and unaffiliated parties for the exercise of free speech rights. To comply with existing law, the university recognizes that it will dedicate its resources to this effort to provide for the public safety of participants.

Attempt to block/ obstruct the speaker's message (physically, or with disruptive sound)

Obstruct or disrupt university operations
