



CONFIRMING YOUR INTENTION TO ENROLL

Congratulations on your acceptance to Buffalo State. To confirm your intention to enroll, please submit your online Admissions Reply Form and Tuition Deposit (\$125).

Please refer to your acceptance letter for instructions. Students who are accepted into the EOP program will need to submit the Admissions Reply Form, but are not required to pay the tuition deposit. Unless otherwise noted, priority deadlines are May 1 for fall enrollment, and November 1 for spring enrollment. Your deposit is applied to tuition charges for your first semester of enrollment. The tuition deposit is not refundable after May 1 for fall, after November 1 for spring, or 30 days after date of acceptance—whichever comes later.

SETTING UP YOUR ACCOUNTS

You have been assigned a Buffalo State student e-mail address. It is important that you check your e-mail regularly as it is the official form of communication for students with all campus offices, including your academic adviser, residence life, financial aid, and your student bill. IMMUNIZATION REQUIREMENTS

New York State Public Health Law and Buffalo State require that all college students show proof of immunity to measles, mumps, and rubella. The law also requires that all college students read the information on meningitis and complete the response form or show proof of immunization within the last five years. This documentation is contained on the enclosed New Student Health Form, which must be completed and filed with the Buffalo State Weigel Wellness Center. Once the form is completed, it can be mailed to the Weigel Wellness Center. You may also e-mail the form to weigel@buffalostate.edu or fax the form to (716) 878-6727.

Don't wait. We strongly recommend that you complete this requirement now. You will not be allowed to register without proper proof of immunizations on file with the wellness center. Refer to the New Student Health Form for the exact immunizations required by law.

Immunization records may be obtained from a health-care provider, high school, or previous college. Transfer students should obtain their health records from their previous school and arrange to have them sent to the Weigel Wellness Center. Forms to request immunization records are

available on the wellness center website. If you attended Buffalo State within the past seven years, it is your responsibility to reactivate your health file by calling the wellness center during business hours (8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.).

FINAL HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPTS AND PROOF OF GRADUATION

Federal law requires that colleges receive verification of high school graduation from all entering first-year and transfer students. Without the required verification of graduation, Buffalo State will be legally unable to grant you a degree or offer you any federal or state financial aid. This includes all Pell and TAP grants, work study, and loans. Once you have graduated, please have your high school send a final official transcript with the date of graduation posted to our Admissions Office.

STUDENTS WITH TRANSFER OR ADVANCED CREDITS

All students with advanced credit (e.g., AP, IB, CLEP, or military credits) should have official score reports sent to the university.

Please take time to set up your Buffalo State University online accounts and provide your contact information for the IT Help Desk. college or university, you must arrange to have all final, official transcripts sent to the Admissions Office as soon as possible. Transfer students who have been admitted must maintain a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher after additional coursework has been calculated. If you plan to take additional courses before enrolling at Buffalo State, you must notify the university in writing. FINANCIAL AID

A significant percentage of Buffalo State students are eligible for some kind of financial assistance. Students who have applied for financial aid and have been accepted to the university will receive an e-mail notifying them of their SUNY Award Letter upon receipt of a valid Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). If you need help, contact Buffalo State's Financial Aid Office. The office is open Monday through Friday all year. You may discuss financial aid options, including grants, loans, employment, and scholarships, in person or by telephone. Please call for an appointment. SCHOLARSHIPS

Buffalo State offers scholarships for students demonstrating outstanding leadership qualities, academic abilities, and/or financial need. First-year and transfer students are reviewed for academic merit scholarships. Students must secure their spot before they are eligible to apply for scholarships. ACCESSIBILITY SERVICES

If you are a student with a disability, IEP plan, or 504 plan, we encourage you to contact the Student Accessibility Services Office to discuss accommodations you may need at Buffalo State. The office coordinates classroom and testing accommodations and makes referrals to appropriate support resources. A meeting to help plan the support services you may need should be done before classes start so that you will have access to the resources to do your best work. Appointments can be scheduled throughout the year as well. The Student Accessibility Services Office's contact information can be found on the last page of this brochure. ORIENTATION

First-year and transfer students interact with faculty and staff, learn about student and academic engagement, and engage in a variety of social activities during New Bengal Orientation. All incoming students are required to attend an Orientation session prior to the start of their first semester at Buffalo State. Orientation allows students to meet faculty, staff, upper-class students, and other incoming peers inside and outside their academic major. Attendance is mandatory and a program fee will be placed on the student's bill. After submitting your deposit, you will receive an e-mail invitation to register for Orientation online (you must first submit your online Admissions Reply Form and Tuition Deposit). An optional parent/family member session is offered at an additional cost and runs concurrently with New Bengal Orientations. REGISTERING FOR CLASSES

FIRST-YEAR STUDENTS: Professional Academic Advisors work with incoming first-year and transfer students to create your fall and spring schedules. After signing up for new student Orientation, you can expect to work with a Professional Academic Advisor to discuss your class schedule. Advisement and registration are generally completed in the summer (for fall semester) and winter (for spring semester). You'll be able to view your schedule in Banner, using the Banner ID included with your offer of admission. If you have questions about getting registered for courses, email advise@buffalostate.edu or call (716) 878-5223.

TRANSFER STUDENTS: You can review your transfer credit evaluation in Degree

Works so you can see how your classes have transferred and what you have left to take at Buffalo State. In order to receive your advising pin to register for classes, you must complete the Transfer Tutorial Modules in your applicant portal. These modules will explain policies, how to read DegreeWorks (your degree audit), general education requirements, and how to use Banner in more detail. Banner is the system you will use to register for your courses. Information is available on the Accepted Student and transfer student advising websites.

Students will be billed for all courses for which they are registered, so you must notify the Admissions Office if your plans change and you no longer wish to attend the university.

LIVING ON CAMPUS

Make Buffalo State University your home away from home and sign up to live on campus. Enjoy easy access to your professors, classrooms, Campbell Student Union, and athletic facilities when you choose to live in the residence halls. Students whose parents live more than 35 miles away from campus must follow the On-Campus Housing Residency Requirement and live on campus for their first two years away from home. However, many students whose home is in or around Buffalo also choose to live in this vibrant campus community. After you submit your tuition deposit, you will have access to the My Housing portal. Log into that portal and submit your Housing Application to secure your space on campus next fall.

HOUSING STYLE	COMMUNITIES	DESCRIPTION
Traditional Style	Bengal, Bishop, Neumann, and Perry Halls	Single or double bedrooms that share floor lounges, bathrooms, and kitchen areas within the community.
Suite Style	North Wing, Tower 1, Tower 2, Tower 3, and Tower 4	3-4 single or double bedrooms that share a semi-private common area and bathroom within a suite.
Apartment Style	Moore Complex and Student Apartment Complex (STAC)	2-4 single or double bedrooms that share a bathroom, common room, kitchen, and dining space; all within one apartment.

ROOMMATE AND ROOM SELECTION

When you apply to live on campus, you will have access to browse and select your roommate for the upcoming year. All students are encouraged to browse, meet, and select other students who are expecting to live on campus. Students who match with a roommate will have first choice in where they live on campus during Room Selection. Room Selection takes place in July and allows students to choose their own rooms for the upcoming year. Students are highly encouraged to participate in the room selection process so they have first choice at all the rooms that are available on campus, including single rooms. Any student who doesn't select a room, or applies after room selection closes, will be assigned to a room and roommate based on the student's preferences noted in their application.

ACADEMIC RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITIES (ARCs)

Students may choose to live in one of several themed communities that bring students who have similar academic or university interests together in one shared living space. These communities are supported by academic and university programs to enhance the living experience. Academic Residential Communities are optimal for students who are looking to surround themselves with others who have shared interests. Students sign up for an ARC on their Housing Application.

INTERNET ACCESS FROM CAMPUS HOUSING

Wireless internet services are available in all residence halls at no additional cost. All halls, other than STAC, offer a wired

ethernet connection as well. Your computer must meet campus system requirements in order to connect to the residence hall system provided by Gig Communications. For more information, please refer to the Residence Life website at residencelife. buffalostate.edu.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT

Buffalo State University requires all firstyear and sophomore students whose permanent residency is beyond a 35-mile radius of Buffalo State to reside on campus for four consecutive semesters or until you earn 60 credits, whichever comes first. MEAL PLANS

Buffalo State Dining offers a variety of meal plans designed to fit the needs of Buffalo State's diverse student population. Meal plans are available for both commuter and resident students. Freshmen and sophomores living on campus are required to select a residential meal plan. Meal plans are tax-free and may be covered by financial aid. When it comes to product variety, Buffalo State Dining offers various dining venues throughout campus to make dining easy and convenient for students. The Bengal Kitchen is the all-you-care-to-eat dining facility located in the Campbell Student Union, with menus and hours designed from student feedback. The retail food court, also located in the Campbell Student Union, offers nine different concepts, including Subway, Market 1300, Sushi Do, Tú Taco, KT Caribbean Cuisine, SPoT Coffee, Create Smoothies & Bubble Tea, wings and fingers from Frank & Teressa's Anchor Bar, and more. Dining also offers additional satellite locations across campus, including a Drink the Moment featuring SPoT Coffee in the Technology Building, a new PlanetariYUM in the Science and Mathematics Complex, and a fully licensed Starbucks in the E. H. Butler Library.

While food is at the forefront of dining, the focus is on guest experience. With different events and rotating menus, we are constantly changing to meet student requests when we can, while addressing the topics of nutrition and health to create an atmosphere of relaxation and education.

The Muriel A. Howard Honors Program is a community of engaged, inquisitive, and interactive students who are supported by dedicated faculty in small, distinctive classes. Each student has a dynamic, customized curriculum that fits their academic goals and enhances post-college plans. Internships, study away or abroad, research opportunities, and community service projects are an integral part of the honors experience.

Students have the benefits of early registration, unique on- and off-campus experiences, free printing and computer usage, and exclusive study spaces.

First-year honors students are paired with Honors Peer Leaders, who can help them navigate campus and provide support during their college transition.

All honors students have the option of living in the honors community within Bishop Hall, which contains an honors-only classroom and meeting space. Honors scholarships are offered to highly qualified students and additional scholarships are available by application.

Buffalo State's admissions committee considers your GPA, the quality and selection of your high school coursework, excellent individual course performance, and demonstrated potential and motivation for success at the college level. Roar 2 Success is an admissions-based student support program designed for new first-year students entering Buffalo State University. This program provides students with support for their first four semesters. It stands for Recognizing Opportunities and Achieving Results, with a strategic mission to aid new students in developing the skills and awareness necessary for success in college. The program offers a holistic approach to student success by addressing both academic and non-academic needs.

Enrolled students benefit from various early connection supports such as college onboarding sessions and the Bengal Bound Summer Bridge program that acclimates students to campus life and its resources in order to facilitate a smooth transition to college. Central to student success, all enrolled students are paired with a Success Navigator. Success Navigators are professional staff who act as guides to their assigned students and ensure that they feel supported every step of the way. Student success is also facilitated by employing a variety of student-centered resources such as personalized success planning, financial literacy, book scholarships, cohort courses, private social events,

mentorship, and access to the Bengal Success Center.

Roar 2 Success helps students create long-l asting community by offering engagement with other campus professionals, academic departments, and peers. The program strives to foster a holistic environment that extends beyond the classroom to help students thrive during their college journey at Buffalo State.


